Offerings for elementary school children emphasize language arts, math, science and social studies concepts – as well as M.E.A.P. skills. The middle and high school programs introduce older students to engineering, design and related disciplines while investigating Michigan Career Pathways.

#1 Pick Your Lesson

Let's Go! Grades K-1

This teacher-lead program engages students with hands-on activities and more. Shapes, colors, numbers and letter sounds are the tools for understanding the exciting world of automobiles. Comprehensive support materials reinforce basic skills by bringing the Museum experience back to your classroom.

Rolling Along! Grades 2-3

This teacher-lead program engages students with simple machines, forces and energy, as well as geography skills related to the story of Walter P. Chrysler and Chrysler's automotive heritage. Pre- and post-visit activities prepare your students to apply concepts reinforced during their Museum experience to the performance standards they are expected to meet.

Cruising Through Time Grades 4-5

This improved program helps your students discover their skills set and the value of old-fashioned teamwork as they build race cars, just like the legendary RAMCHARGERS team. We help you organize students into teams and provide cross-curricular activities to extend the field trip within your classroom.

Where in the World Grades 6-8

This new program allows your students to exchange ideas, products and currencies in building a new Chrysler Town & Country Minivan and Jeep® Wrangler. The program's cross-cultural lessons highlight how societies around the world make use of automobiles.

Exploring Automotive Change and Challenges Grades 8+

Using Chrysler as the example, this expanded program highlights how streamlining in the 1930s, downsizing in the 1970s and today's search for energy alternatives have brought new and unexpected jobs to the automotive workforce. Critical-thinking exercises and hands-on experiences help your students explore their own unique career preferences.
